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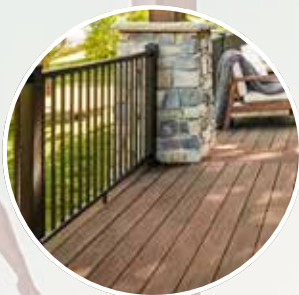
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LETTER

The economy continues to face significant headwinds in 2026, including higher energy costs and renewed inflationary pressure. According to NAHB, core PCE inflation rose to 3.4%, its highest level in three years and well above the Federal Reserve's 2% target. Despite these challenges, recession risk remains contained, with continued job growth and a low unemployment rate.

The labor market has slowed, adding 57,000 jobs in June. Residential construction employment declined by 8,900 workers during the month and is down 48,800 over the past year. Remodeling remains a bright spot for the housing industry, with improvement-related spending increasing 8.1% year over year, compared with a 4% decline in single-family construction spending.

On the policy front, the historic 21st Century ROAD to Housing Act became law on July 11, 2026, expanding housing supply and improving affordability.

Material Availability & Cost Updates

Compared to a year ago, steel is up 30.6%, aluminum is up 35.3% and copper is up 21.8%. Looking at the month change, steel is up 2.7%, aluminum is down 13.5%, and copper is down 2.4%.

Lumber: Lumber futures are up from last month to \$627 per 1,000 board feet, compared to \$608 on June 5th. In other news the U.S. Declines to Renew USMCA Trade Pact. Please read more about it through <https://www.nahb.org/blog/2026/07/usmca-not-renewed>.

A Home Built by Students, Powered by Our Industry

The Madison Area Builders Association is dedicated to leading workforce development in our community and nationally, constantly pushing the envelope to find new and impactful ways to create immersive experiences for youth and young adults to learn about opportunities in the skilled trades and construction industry.

MABA's Strategic Plan sets forth several objectives to increase the local labor market, including developing a student home build that will allow students the opportunity to build a home and learn about the various trades and opportunities.

MABA, in partnership with the MABA Foundation, Encore Homes, and the Middleton Cross Plains School District (MCPSD) is making this objective a reality and you can be part of this amazing opportunity too!

In late July, the MABA Foundation finalized a contract with Encore Homes and will finance the construction of a home in the Redtail Ridge neighborhood off Pheasant Branch Road in Middleton. Construction begins in August 2026 and will be completed in June 2027. The home will be featured in the 2027 Parade of Homes, with the students who built it present during the Parade to

give tours and talk to consumers about the valuable skills they learned.

MABA and the MABA Foundation plan to reinvest the proceeds from this home into additional student builds. They hope that the proceeds from future homes will self-fund further student home builds with MCPSD and other school districts across the area.

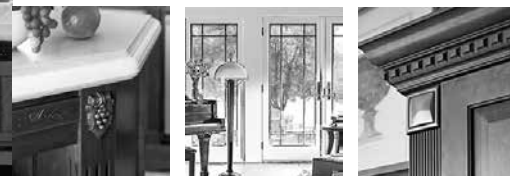

FINANCIAL STATEMENT UPDATE

MABA Finances Stay Strong Through Midyear

MABA remained in strong financial position through June 30, 2026, with actual net operating income exceeding the year-to-date budget by \$14,000. The LPL Investments have remained largely flat for the calendar year, but maintains a balance of over \$2.3 Million.

Accounts receivable remained higher than usual due to the large number of events Chad forces—I mean, encourages—Lisa to plan, but the outstanding balances are expected to be fully collectible.

Several programs performed ahead of budget. MABA membership dues are ahead of budget, and we also saw savings on membership expenses. WOW, you all really

love sporting events! The Spring Sporting Clays, Golf League, MABA Foundation Golf Outing, and MABA Golf Outing are all expected to exceed projections.

But if you know me—this is Lisa, by the way—you know I don't always have the rosy outlook Chad has. There are some areas we're closely watching in the budget, and if that means I have to give Chad a good talking-to, you know I'll do it!

Overall, MABA's core operations remained ahead of budget through the first six months of the year, supported by strong membership revenue, increased operating cash, and positive performance from several events and programs.

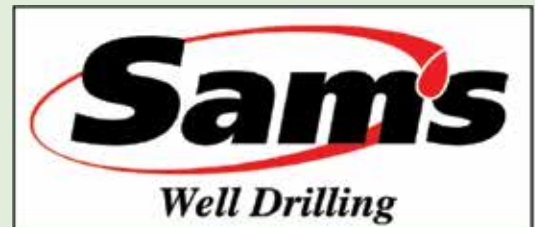
Steve Hanrahan Recognized as Hometown Housing Hero Ahead of Retirement

MABA congratulates Steve Hanrahan, Chief Operating Officer of Habitat for Humanity of Dane County, on his retirement after more than a decade of service to affordable housing in Dane County.

Hanrahan, a longtime member of the MABA Government Affairs Committee, has been an important voice in housing affordability efforts and a partner in advancing opportunities for homeownership throughout the region. His work has supported responsible growth, including in Sun Prairie, where Habitat Dane is developing Town Hall Crossing, the largest Habitat for Humanity development in Wisconsin. The 62-acre neighborhood will include 118 single-family homes, with at least 40% owned by Habitat homeowners. The project reflects Hanrahan's lasting commitment to creating attainable housing for local families.

In recognition of his leadership and impact, Hanrahan was recently named the Hometown Housing Hero at the Regional Housing Strategy Summit. The award honors his years of service, advocacy, and contributions to expanding access to affordable housing in Dane County.

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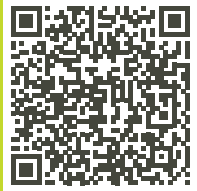


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MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

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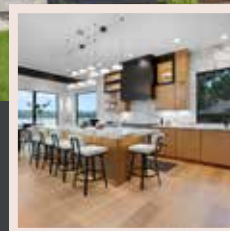


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
